INTRODUCTION

This is the fourth Annual Report of the School of Social Sciences in the Atkinson Faculty of Liberal and Professional Studies at York University. The mandate of the School of Social Sciences is to provide students from diverse backgrounds with top-ranked disciplinary and interdisciplinary programs that have a social justice and human rights orientation, and to support innovative research that addresses current issues confronting communities of marginalized and disadvantaged peoples. Through an integrated approach that values cultural diversity and promotes social change, the School offers a learning environment that provides students with a solid and critical grounding in social science research methods and theories. In addition to degree programs in Sociology, Social Science, Political Science, and Race, Ethnicity and Indigeneity, the School offers several streams and professional certificates that encourage students to develop an integrated understanding of current events, locally and globally. These streams also include several innovative courses in Human Geography.

During 2007-08, we further consolidated our Social Science programs in several areas so that we continue to broaden and strengthen our interdisciplinary approach, examining important social issues from a variety of perspectives. Extensive outreach and consultation went into the establishment of the Race, Ethnicity and Indigeneity (REI) degree program. The first group of students enrolled in Fall 2007. In October, a gala launch of the new REI program was organized with two keynote speakers- Dr. Robert Keith Collins, Professor in Native American Studies, San Francisco State University and our own Dr. Haideh Moghissi, Professor of Sociology, Atkinson Faculty of Liberal and Professional Studies, York University. The opening remarks were given by President Mamdouh Shoukri and Dean Rhonda Lenton. Hundreds of students, community and university colleagues attended the function, which was widely covered by campus and community media.

In addition, a proposal for a new degree program in Human Rights and Equity Studies (HRES) was put together with extensive consultation with colleagues both on and off-campus. It is now in the hands of Senate. Finally, a proposal has been put forward to rename the School of Social Sciences as Department of Equity Studies as of July 1, 2009 to be located as an autonomous unit in the new Faculty of Liberal Arts and Professional Studies (FLAPS).

As in previous years, the School organized a successful lunch hour seminar series, featuring presentations by faculty members. An event to commemorate March 21, the U. N. declared day for the elimination of Racism, was also planned and implemented. It was very well attended by students and community members.

We welcomed a new faculty member, Patricia O'Riley, as well as a visiting professor from South Africa, Salim Vally.

A great deal of our energy this past year continued to be diverted to dealing with the restructuring of liberal studies at the Keele Campus of York University, however it was also a time to clarify and further sharpen our distinctive vision and commitment to social change and social justice education for working students.

We hope that this overview of the activities of our faculty in the School of Social Sciences during 2007-08 will give you a sense of the optimism, creativity and commitment that underpins the School.
